

MEMBER SPOTLIGHT



THE CHILDREN'S CENTER

The Children's Center has been providing services to young children with special needs and their families since 1966. The daughter of Priscilla Chavarie, founder of the organization, was diagnosed with cerebral palsy at the age of two. Despite recommendations to institutionalize her daughter and focus on the healthy children at home, Priscilla gathered parents experiencing similar challenges to create the first school for children with special needs in central Maine. They formed the United Cerebral Palsy Association of Mid-State Maine, which evolved and grew into the Children's Center we know today.

The agency provides a continuum of center- and home-based services for young children with disabilities and their families in a format that is not offered elsewhere in this region. They serve Kennebec and Somerset Counties through the Augusta site and a branch in Skowhegan. They offer inclusive, early intervention programs including an Autism Program, a Behavioral Support Program, Special Education, Pediatric Therapies (Occupational Therapy and Speech and Language Therapy), and child care for both children who are typically and atypically developing. The organization also provides family services for young children with special needs, such as Children's Targeted Case Management for children with developmental delays and/or behavioral health needs, one-on-one Rehabilitative Community Support Services for children with functional limitations, and Parent Education and Support Groups for caregivers seeking information and guidance from other parents and/or professionals.

Though the center has experienced many shifts and organizational changes over the years, their values remain - they strive to meet the needs of all children by offering quality programs that encourage individual growth, provide support for their families, and promote inclusion of all children in the community.


